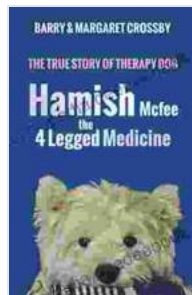

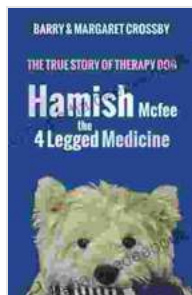

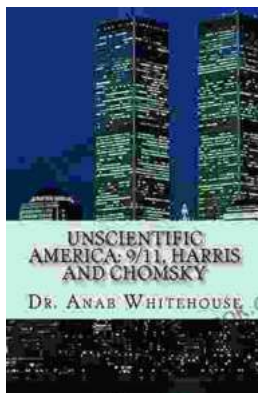

Hamish McFee by Ptolemy Tompkins

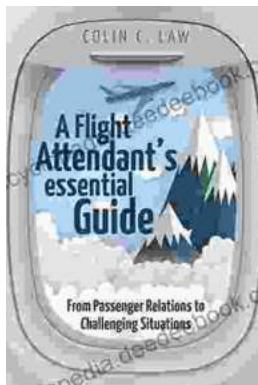
