but today they're often used to generate electricity. I live near a windmill, and I love to watch it turn in the wind. It's a beautiful and peaceful sight.



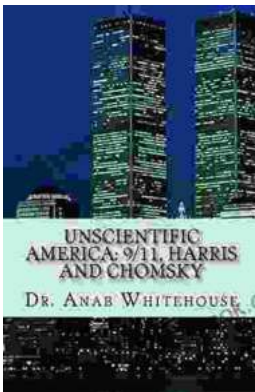

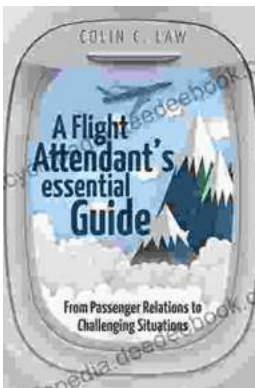
