


What is Unseen Poetry?


Tips for Answering Unseen Poetry Questions

- Identify the key features of the poem. What is the poem about?
 What is the poet's tone? What techniques does the poet use?
- Develop a personal response. What do you think the poem is about?
 Why do you think the poet wrote it?

 Answer the questions clearly and concisely. Make sure you answer all parts of the question and that your answers are well-supported by evidence from the poem.



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
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
